Submission to the Inquiry into the Fair Work Amendment (Small Business-Penalty Rates Exemption) Bill 2012

I am a permanent employee, working as a nurse, currently earning around \$40 per hour.

I have a family with three school-age children. I am the sole provider for the family. We have a mortgage on our home.

If penalty rates were abolished my fear is that I would be required to work weekends and/or after hours. Also, my income would drop significantly.

My weekends are important to me because it is the time I spend with my family. We can organise to spend the whole day together, where as during the week they have school and I am coming home late from work.

I urge the committee to keep all penalty rates.

While we may live in a 24/7 world, as stated by some business representatives, our families do not. We implore government to use the same argument for 'family values' that quashed the gay marriage legislation to prevent these changes coming in to force.
