My weekends are important to me because...I am distant from my family. I have to take holiday pay to visit my family on weekends that I work. I work on some public holidays to make up pay for big bills.

I urge the committee to keep penalty rates. The retail sector depends on women and young workers. Don't lock them into low retirement superannuation or perpetuate teh two speed economy. Retail workers are not the only working poor Australians. Thousands rely on penalty rates to pay mortgages, medical and other bills. I urge Senate members to reject any moves to normalise working days. Do Senate members sit every Sunday? Or on Anzac afternoon? Boxing Day? Please don't take away special pay for special days.
