I urge the committee to keep penalty rates. Times are tough enough now with everyday living costs. Nearly all of us have everyday positions, and do not get travel, meal, petrol and probably day care allowances, nor a company car. "We Struggle enough". Cost of living is already ridiculous. We and many of our children have to try to live in this already expensive island.
