Noise of Wind Farms

I support the Renewable Energy (Electricity) Amendment (Excessive noise from Wind Farms) Act 2012

I wish to voice my concerns over the excessive noise from wind turbines for the following reasons.

The main objection being the noise generated from turbines is now well noted and peer-reviewed by noted Professors from around the world that turbines are causing many health problems mainly sleep deprivation.
